James Carroll, youth pastor for Fountain of Life Covenant in Long Beach, suggested we talk to four of his students who had received scholarships to attend Alpine. They were all eager to share their experience:

Gio: a senior, said "there's just lots of laughing and talking with friends. We get closer to each other as a youth group when we are at Alpine. This weekend at chapel, I knew God wanted to tell me something: that I feel called to teach. That was important. I've never told anyone that before. I also learned from the speaker to be more open about my faith. Nothing is an accident. And now I am starting to write down prayers."

Carlo: a sophomore, said "Alpine is one of the reasons I started going to church regularly. What we

experience at Alpine gives us a chance to speak about our faith. The bonds that happen here are important."

Brooke: a freshman, said "I accepted Christ here at Alpine the summer of 2015. It is impactful every time I'm here. I experience community. I experience valuable lessons like vulnerability. There are always take-aways that really help me when I go back down the mountain. Coming up here in nature and listening to speakers I can relate to is a great experience. It's really cool."

**Johnathan:** a junior, said "It's great being here at Alpine: being with friends, building bonds, learning about God

with your friends. We're kids: we have our whole life ahead of us – a lot of us are lost. Every time I come to Alpine, there's confirmation of what I'm learning about God – to rejuvenate in the Lord. It's good to come up here and refresh. I'm encouraged to share Christ with my friends. I don't forget what I learn at Alpine."

**Chandler, AZ,** suggested we hear from one of his scholarship students, Katie, a 7th grader:

"It's my first time at Alpine. We had a lot of fun with the group activities! Chapel kind of changed my life this weekend. My friends and I were crying because we devoted our lives back to Christ. During worship, I thought about all that has happened and that God was there for me. One of my friends also gave his life to Christ. There are a lot of caring people here. It feels like God is with you here. The speaker talked about how to act toward others and I want to show my Christian faith to my friends. Thank you to the camp and the people who sent money to help me be here."

Last year, 429 campers received scholarships to come to camp. That was a total of \$69,418 scholarship funds. Scholarships require an application process and cover a percentage of the registration fee. The requests for scholarships is growing. We hope to provide as much as the need requires, and we rely on your participation in this huge, and honestly, glorious endeavor.
